NOTICE OF RACE

NB: The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Sailing Instructions means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

The notation [SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing or a discretionary penalty applied by the international jury with a hearing.

1 Rules

- **1.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2 This World championships will be governed by the IFDCO Class Rules 2016, The ISAF Equipment Rules of sailing and IFDCO Championship Rules.
- 1.3 Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs) when afloat shall be worn when flag Y is displayed ashore except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices
- **1.4** If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.5 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located at the Lower Lounge Nelson Yacht Club.
- **1.6** Appendix T will apply.



2 ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising and bow numbers chosen and supplied by the organising authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. [DP]

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the International Flying Dutchman class.
- **3.2** Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached online entry form at www.fd-worlds.com and making the required entry fee payment.
- 3.3 The fully completed entry form shall be received by the Organising Authority no later than December 14, 2018 accompanied by the required entry fee.
- 3.4 Late entries may be accepted with payment of the entry fee plus the late entry fee at the race committee's discretion until 2400Hrs 11 January 2019
- 3.5 To be eligible to compete in this event each entrant and crew member shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the entrant and crew member's national authority. All helms and crews shall be fully paid up members of the IFDCO for 2019.
 Proof of affiliated club membership is to be presented at registration.

6 MEASUREMENTS

- **6.1** Each boat shall produce a valid measurement certificate and measurement form.
- **6.2** A boat shall comply with RRS 78.1 at all times.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The supplementary sailing instructions will be made available after 0900hrs on 11th February 2019 at Nelson Yacht Club Lower Lounge. In addition, we will have an on-line notice board at www.fdwc-nelson-2018.co.nz FD Worlds.

8 VENUES

- **8.1** Attachment A shows the location of the regatta venue.
- **8.2** Attachment A shows the location of the racing area.

9 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be as follows: windward/leeward and triangular courses including windward, reaching and leeward marks. Course diagrams will be supplied with sailing Instructions.

10 PENALTY SYSTEM

Decisions of the International Jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

11 SCORING

11.1 The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply.

11.2 The New Zealand Championships

- a) Five (5) races are required to be completed to Constitute a series.
- b) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- c) When 5 to 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

11. 3 2019 IFD World Championships:

- a) Five (5) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- b) When 6 to 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.



c) When 8 to 9 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

12 SUPPORT BOATS

- **12.1** Support boats shall register with the Organising Authority during the entry period.
- **12.2** Support boats shall prominently display an identification flag bearing the three-letter code of their national flag of the competitor's nation they are supporting.
- 12.3 Support boats shall be kept at least 100 metres clear of the course during racing except when asked to assist by the Race Committee or in case of emergency. [DP]

13 BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while they are in the boat park. It remains at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority where a competing boat can be stored throughout the period of the New Zealand World Championships. DP]

14 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

15 PRIZES

15.1 Prizes will be given as follows:

Flying Dutchman World Championships

Dunhill Challenge Trophy (World Championship Overall Winner)

Championship prizes to be awarded to the top 10 teams overall

FD Silver Sombrero Challenge Trophy (World Championship for the best result without discard)

Tullio Pizzomo Memorial Trophy (Best helmsman under 26 yrs)

100 + Trophy (best team combined age 100+)

Best FD Lady (Ladies)

25+ Trophy (highest placed boat 25 yrs of age of older)

Flying Dutchman NZ National Championships

The Rothmans Gallon (First overall resident)

The Wooden Boat Trophy (First resident wooden boat overall)

The Milton Pope Trophy (First resident boat on handicap)

15.2 Additional Prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

16 INSURANCES

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of NZ\$ 3 million per incident or the equivalent.



17 DISCLAIMERS OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

18 SAFETY

18.1 Navigation Safety Bylaw 218 restricts the movement of boats within Nelson Harbour. The diagram on the Official Notice Board shows the restricted and designated areas. Fines can be incurred for breaching this Bylaw

18.2 Particular attention is drawn to:

- An exclusion zone of 50m around any wharf or vessel tied to a wharf, and
- A Moving Prohibition Zone and Total Exclusion Zone around any vessel of 3000GMT or more entering or leaving the harbour. This zone extends to 500 metres in front and 100 metres to either side and to the rear of the vessel. Consequently, the harbour entrance is a total exclusion zone during the entry or exit of any such vessel


